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Employment Services

Public basic labor exchange system that assists job seekers in finding employment and employers in filling jobs through a computer based matching system WorkinTexas.com. There are no income eligibility requirements. Job seekers and employers may visit WorkinTexas.com to register for work, list job openings, and access occupational information and career tools.

Veteran & Foster Youth Services

Priority of services is provided to Veterans and eligible others in all workforce center services.

Alchemy Training

Internet based training that includes mandated training such as Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Family Medical Leave Act (FMLA) and food industry specific training. Hard copy transcripts verify completion of modules of individual employees.

Provelt Assessments

Software to assess the skills of job applicants or current employees for: Software Applications, Office/Professional, Healthcare, Financial, Legal, Accounting, and Industrial.

Rapid Response Services

Specific services are available to businesses and effected workers due to downsizing or business closure. We offer on-site services to assist workers facing job losses.

Workforce Innovation & Opportunity (WIOA)

Offers programs for persons with limited family income. Its goal is to increase the employment, retention, and earnings of eligible participants, and increase occupational skill attainment by participants, and, as a result, improve the quality of the workforce, reduce welfare dependency, and enhance the productivity and competitiveness of the Nation.

WIOA for In School and Out of School Youth

Provides the Golden Crescent with funds to carry out youth activities and statewide workforce investment activities. WIOA provides employment and training services for disadvantaged youth.

WIOA for Dislocated Workers

Program offers unique programs for persons who have lost their jobs in mass layoffs or plant closings, or who have been laid off and are unlikely to return to their jobs. Also provides on-site services to assist workers facing job losses. Rapid Response provides early intervention assistance designed to transition workers to their next employment as soon as possible.

Trade Adjustment Assistance (TAA)

A federal entitlement program to assist workers that lost their jobs because of their company's decline in production or sales due to increased imports or outsourcing of jobs to foreign countries.

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)/Choices

Serves individuals who are on public assistance to help them become employed in a job that leads to self-sufficiency.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Employment and Training Program (SNAP E&T)

Assists recipients in obtaining employment through participation in work programs and education and training activities.

Child Care

Support service to parents who are working or in a training/educational environment. The goal is to assist the parent in reaching self-sufficiency. The service is a priority to parents that are successfully involved in workforce center programs and limited availability to those individuals that are working or training. All child care enrollment is based on the availability of funds.

Communities in Schools (CIS)

Golden Crescent is part of a national program to help at-risk youth stay in school. CIS brings together local resources to offer services that include career guidance, mentoring, pre-employment and employment opportunities, educational enhancement, enrichment activities, and health and family guidance.

NCP- Non Custodial Parents

A collaborative effort between the Texas Office of the Attorney General (OAG) and the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) to implement a model employment project for low-income non-custodial parents (NCPs) of children who are current or recent recipients of public assistance, and who are behind on their child support payments
